

Short Synopsis

Over a long weekend visiting the region's best wineries and restaurants and eating and drinking their way across the Great Southern, Sully stumbles across Alison, a rough and raucous grape picker who turns his life wonderfully upside down.

Perry is a Junior Investment Banker and Sully's co-worker and closest friend. They share an office space and are inseparable. Perry has been trying to help Sully get through his latest ordeal but is running out of moves.

In a desperate bid to shake his best friend out of his depressive torpor, he convinces him to head to the Great Southern wine region for a week away, which he hopes will awaken a new lease on life for Sully, as well as get him closer to convincing one or two wineries to merge with an Asian food and beverage conglomerate he's just taken under his wing.

Sully is a workaholic financial analyst living in the big city who's currently suffering from a severely broken heart after his long term Balinese fiance canceled their wedding and moved to Sydney with his Boss.

Unable to shake the fallout from the breakup and questioning his will to live, he spends his days in an unshakeable fog, and his nights eating poorly made Gado Gado, listening to Gamelan music and watching Indonesian horse racing.

Impact on Tourism, The Great Southern Wine Region and potential earnings.

The comedy/drama wine film Sideways, which showcased the Napa Valley and Santa Barbara wine regions of California was made in 2004 and starred then relatively unknown character actor Paul Giamatti, as well as TV and Theatre actors Thomas Hayden Church, Virginia Madsen and Sandra Oh.

The film changed all of the actors careers garnering multiple award nominations and wins including Academy Awards, Critics Choice Awards, Independent Spirit Awards as well as Screen Actors Guild Awards. The film grossed over \$100M worldwide.









Sideways had such an impact on film and wine lovers, that there are today several companies operating Sideways wine tours to the wineries featured in the film nearly twenty years after the film's release.

Some of the winemakers that appeared in Sideways can still be found producing quality wine at the same wineries that were featured in the film.

The Great Southern Film Co-Op (GSFC) was founded by author and filmmaker Adam Morris in order to make feature film production viable in the Great Southern Region. The Co-Op is a collection of businesses, sponsors and arts patrons that have come together with the goal of making ten feature films over a ten year period (2022-2032).

Crushed will be the fifth feature film made here in the Great Southern after Edward and Isabella (2022), Frank and Frank (2023), Frederickstown (2024) and Low Lie the Fields (2025).
